

**By Phone:** Phone registrations are accepted using VISA, MasterCard or Discover; debit and credit cards are processed through our secure web portal.

In Person: Walk-in registration is available at our center. You may pay by cash, check or credit/debit card. Cash payments will only be accepted in person and must be for the exact amount. There is a \$30 charge for returned checks.

Where applicable, individual tuition, lab and materials fees are listed in the course description. In cases of documented hardship, payment plans may be arranged with the director *for certificate programs only*.

#### **Registration Confirmation**

Registration confirmations are sent through our online catalog. You will be contacted about class cancelations. If there are insufficient registrations, classes will be canceled five (5) business days in advance of the class start date, so register early! Registrations are accepted as long as space is available.

#### Refunds

A full refund will be issued if a course is canceled. Refunds will be issued for student registrations canceled seven (7) days before the start of the class. The first step in determining the right option for you is to meet with our student advisor. She will review both options with you, and together you'll explore the option that is best. To learn more, stop by our Learning Center at 11 Avery Lane or, give us a call at 207.664.7110, or e-mail us at adultedinfo@ellsworthschools.org.

**Earn a High School Equivalency Diploma!** The HiSET is designed as a test of the knowledge and skills developed in high school. There are five individual tests, covering material on a range of subjects including English, Writing, Math, Social Studies and Science.

Reach out to us for an informal meeting with our student advisor to find out what to expect on the HISET, how to interpret questions, options for studying to pass the tests, and essential strategies, including test taking skills. After meeting with the advisor, when you are ready, perhaps even the same day, you can start taking the practice tests. Then your advisor will help you make a plan to pass the HiSET test and earn a diploma that will open doors for you. We also offer career advising to all our HiSET students.

People often ask how long it will take and it's impossible to predict until we meet with you and you take some assessments. It takes courage for most people to make the connection with us, but our staff is respectful, patient, kind and competent. They have a lot of experience assisting people to prepare for the HiSET and/or developing a plan that best meets learner goals.

HiSET practice and official testing are available daytime and evening hours weekly throughout the year. A schedule of test dates is available at our learning center and on our website:

www.ellsworth.maineadulted.ora.

The Adult Diploma option gives you the chance to take up where you left off in school. Past student experience and data show that this option is realistic if you need a couple of credits. It requires significant self-motivation and a commitment of at least 45 hours per credit. Ellsworth Adult & Community Education requires 20 credits. Most adults who have started with the diploma program have transitioned to the HiSET when they realize the value of the HiSET and the fact that they may be able to reach their goals more quickly.

#### From the Director

Our program continues to grow and change to meet the needs of the community. A big change for us is our center is moving from our Mill Mall location to a beautiful new facility at 11 Avery Lane in Ellsworth. Our center will be co-located with the Ellsworth School Department's central office and district-wide departments. Our center footprint is smaller, which affords us the opportunity to collaborate with schools and organizations in the community to offer classes throughout the city. With our small and mighty team, it will take some time to figure out how to manage these programs across the city during the day and evening, so our fall programming will be somewhat limited. Many of the locations are not confirmed at the time of this printing, but updated information will be available in our online catalog, or by contacting our program. Thanks in advance for your patience as we navigate this new landscape.

We are thrilled to highlight several of our significant collaborations and expansions which are a focus this year. First, we are partnering with the City of Ellsworth and several other organizations to address digital equity across the city and region (pp. 15-20). Second, we are partnering with the city, the Ellsworth Area Chamber of Commerce, and other organizations and businesses to promote economic development in Ellsworth, by offering and facilitating affordable, responsive and relevant workforce training opportunities that meet the real needs of local businesses (p. 12). Third, we are working with childcare providers in the region to find concrete ways to expand their workforce. Fourth, we plan to partner with schools, businesses and organizations to meet the expanding need for support of multilingual individuals and families moving into our community.
